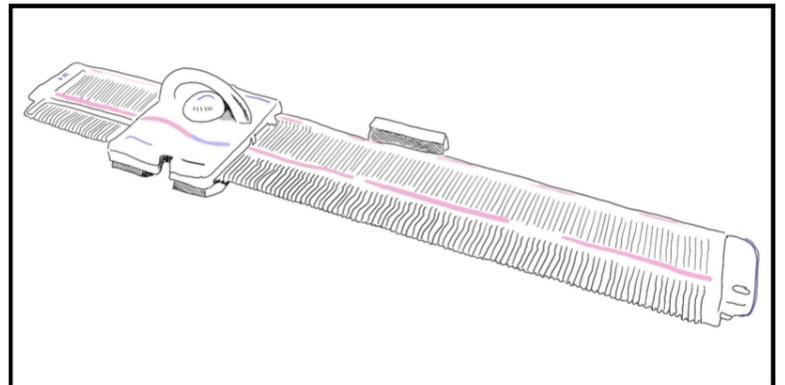

new machine



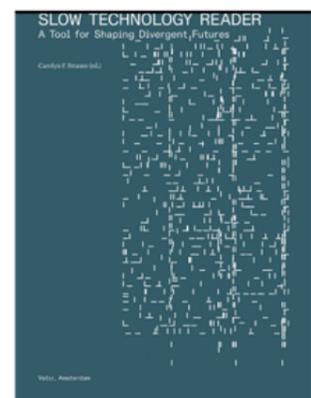
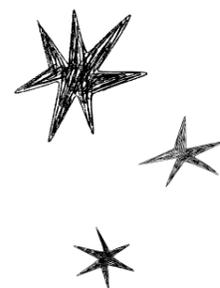
A new machine has joined the lab: the Silver Reed LK150 knitting machine. It's now available for experiments in textiles, computation, and hands-on making. Come try it out!
